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1.1 Homework is an important part of students' learning; it supports and extends learning begun in class and enables students to develop habits of study and strategies for personal organisation and time management. It is also a means by which parents can support and show a direct interest in young peoples' learning.

1.2 Homework tasks will vary according to subjects and learning activities, but the principles remain the same. All homework that is set must follow the school policy and timetable.

2 Homework Policy:

All homework must be purposeful and meet one of the following purposes:

- Independent Learning
- Extending Learning
- Consolidating Learning
- Informing and Involving Parents
- Managing Demands (eg coursework)
- Preparing for lesson activities

3 Homework Timetable.

In order to enable pupils to experience high quality, purposeful homework that supports and extends learning pupils are not assigned specific homework on specific nights; the class teacher takes responsibility for setting the homework when it is appropriate, following the principles listed above and the times that pupils are expected to spend on homework listed below. This guidance is printed in all pupils' diaries.

In KS3 pupils can expect:

4 Homework Principles

Homework should not be set for the next day, unless it's a short consolidation task or preparation task.

All homework must receive feedback: formal/informal/teacher assessed/peer or self-assessed, or be used as part of the learning process, as a starter, for example.

5 The setting and recording of Homework

We are preparing our students to be learners in the modern world. All homework at Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4 will be set via Bloodle through Homework Blocks. This sends an email notification to the student's Blue Coat email account, students also have the option to record this homework in their Student Planners.

6 Supporting students with Homework

There are Homework Clubs that departments offer to support learning during lunchtimes and after school - these clubs are published in the Student Planner and on the school website.

7 Systems for monitoring and ensuring that homework is effective.

- **Classroom teachers** have the responsibility to set homework via Homework Blocks, as per school and departmental policy. It is essential that homework, in a similar way to classwork, is *differentiated*.
- **Heads of Department** have the responsibility to ensure that there is a clear understanding of the homework policy and ensure consistency across the department through student voice, learning walks, bloodle checks and book scrutiny.
- **Form Tutors** have the responsibility to monitor completion of homework by pupils in their forms in line with general pastoral monitoring and also signpost students to appropriate support if any issues arise
- **DoLs** have the responsibility to look at homework practice over a number of weeks, monitoring practice and policy through spot checks, pupil voice etc.
- **SLT** will check the quality and consistency of homework across school through student voice, learning walks, bloodle checks and book scrutiny.
